



Pages 240-243 Partition of Estate of John Hart dec'd viz The equal undivided half of a tract of land on the Ohio River (only entered in name of John H. Hart) & John Hart deceased Nov 4, 1823 beginning at a stone near a large rock there between on the bank of the River upper corner to Benefit Thompson's Survey No. 375 running with his line N. 46° E. 220 rods carrying a branch about 80 rods to a rock upper back corner to Boundary stone N. 5° E. 100 rods to an old Burley house N. 85° E. 73 rods to a Burley's old house and from thence S. 54° E. 26 rods carrying (west) Run about 260 rods to an Elm and 2 sugar trees on the bank of the river thence down the river N. 54° E. 25 rods carrying (west) Run about 7 rods to the beginning of a cut to the cells of land patented containing 2.5 acres more or less - the base land which was conveyed by the said John Hart to Mr. Cooper.

Commissioner's Report 15 Dec 1825  
Set off to the heirs of John Hart 17 A. 28.21 R. on the lower side of the tract and to the heirs of John Hart 12 A. 1.19 R. on the lower side of the tract of the last mentioned quantity 36 A. 2 R. 24 C. on the lower side of it for widow Dowler.




Pages 245-247 Sale of Real Estate of H. Brown dec'd viz.  
Lot No. 74.34 on the original Plat of Cincinnati.



Set off to widow as her Dower in Lot 74.34 33 ft off N. side and Lot 74.34 34 ft front on Madison St in N.E. cor of block. Extent 2.32 ac. 90 ft. It was represented to the attorney that the part of Market in the above plot (being a part of Lot 34) in the front market 34 had been sold 1824.

Vol. 65 p. 322-301 (163) James N. Caldwell Petition of Partition between himself and Archibald William Taylor, heirs of Philip Taylor dec'd of the following estate in Cincinnati. A Lot on Broadway Street, the Lower Market St. & an alley, bounded about 121 ft by street, Market St. 2.156 1/4 ft by Broadway N. about 121 ft by St. of St. & 136 1/4 ft by a 12 ft alley running from thence to Lower Market St. below the aforesaid lots to the New Concertina Theatre except of the Lower Market St. from a lot 25 ft front by 70 ft deep at the N.E. cor of said alley & Lower Market St. bounded by Nathan Brown, T. E. Hale and James McDaniel. It also extends a lot on Lower Market St. of 25 ft front by 50 ft deep adjoining the E. line of said McDaniel's house, so recently conveyed by the U.S. Bank to the said Archibald William Taylor by Deed of Aug. 16, 1831, and afterwards the same individually held by said Archibald William Taylor to the said Caldwell St. by a Deed of Dec 15, 1832, recorded in Book No. 40, p. 627, and of Nov 16, 1832. Record of same book page 625 which gives a more full Description.



Vol. 65 p. 322-325 (113) Petition (filed Nov. 24, 1835) for sale of Estate of James Vane dec'd 1819. Part of Sec. 2, T. 7, R. 2, M. C. Beginning at the N. line of two acres of land owned of John H. Hartman at Geo. Burden, N.E. cor. which is 8 ch. 7 l. from the Ohio River, thence N. with the same line 13 chs. 16. 1/2 ls. to the N.E. cor of the tract, which is witnessed by two Survey Trees, thence E. with the N. line of the tract 2 ch. 59. 1/2 ls. to a Stake, thence N. 11° E. 70. 1/2 ls. to a stake, thence S. 25° E. 3 ch. 84. 1/2 ls. to a stone planted in McDowell line, thence with his & Burden line 6 ch. 24. 1/2 ls. to the place of beginning containing 5 1/2 acres cutting off of said tract however 1/10 of said lot George Burden line, its whole length. Vol. 65 p. 316-322 (67) Petition (filed Sept 11, 1832) for sale of Estate of Charles Bryant dec'd. In Cincinnati being part of Lot No. 8 on the map of Partition between the Heirs of Seth Cather dec'd, and being the part set off to Seth R. Cather bounded as follows Beginning at a stake on the road leading to Mill Creek at the S.E. cor of the said lot No. 8, thence with the S. line of ther. 4 ch. 50. 1/2 ls. thence N. 11° E. 4 ch. 44. the thence E. 4 ch. 50. L. thence N. E. 4 ch. 44. to the Beginning (except a lot 40 ft front on the S. line of said lot No. 8) of deep in the S.E. cor of said lot belonging to the said Charles Bryant but held by him in his life time) also a lot N.E. of the above containing nearly 2 A. fronting on Bay Miller St. and running back west being a part of lot No. 7 on the map of Partition of original and probably running back into lot No. 8 on the aforesaid Map and being the same purchased by the interests of H.
