



In respect to the small Lot of 2 acres in the S.E. cor of the tract the commissioners only thought the said lot had been deeded to Martha Head by her father the angular road line through said quarter beginning at a stake in that line of 20 ft. of S.E. cor of said lot No 9 & in further distance of 20 ft. to the E. line of said quarter, Sept 8, 1832. 



The estate ought not to divide but the widow Anna set off in the 1/2 acre lot described as follows: Beginning at A on the South of the Common wall line running N. 71° E. 62 ft. to a stone thereof 14 ft. 45 in. to stone thereof 10 ft. 11 in. to stone thereof 17 ft. 13 in. to a stone end 12 in. 6 ft. 2 in. E. 1 ft. 7 in. the same N. 71° 52' 50. 1 ft. 11 in. to a small building on the S. side of the river thereof 5 in. 10 ft. 2 in. to a bay window on the S. side of the river thereof 7 ft. 15 in.
