



Page 516, 522, August Term, 1831 (107) Partition of estate of Thomas Ramsey, dec'd. v/s. No. 1.  
Circumstances requiring at N.W. corner of Lot No. 1, there running N. only, or 40' S. about 145.  
ft. to a stone & log cabin, there being 100 ft. by ground of lot. There being 100 ft. to the E. side of the street to place of beginning. L. 1. 100'. See lot 600, p. 55.

Page 579-600. February Term, 1831) Sale of estate of Jacobus Biggs, dec'd.

1) one tract of land being partly in Hamilton, partly in Clermont County, supposed to contain 625 acres more or less.

2) Round Bottom Mills with 60 acres of land, more or less.

3) all his estate in the W. side of the Little Miami in the County of Hamilton, adjacent to the said mill tract, known as the Round Bottom farm containing 650 acres.

4) One lot situated at the mouth of Coney Creek N. side in Columbia Township, 2.5 acres more or less December 9, 1827. The 6.28 acres in Hamilton.

& Clermont counties were divided (by Commissioners & themselves) as follows: Lot No. 1. Beginning at 4 holly bushes on the point at the junction of the East Fork and Little Miami River, thence 180' N. 200' poles, to a stake formerly 3 black bushes, corner to Lot No. 2, thence N. 67° E. 238' poles to a blue ash tree, thence 58' E. 32' poles to a stone situate from a blue ash, with 3 chips, N. 71° E. 23' links, connect to Lot No. 2, and in the line of Lot No. 3, thence N. 23° E. 23' poles, to a stone situate from a sugar tree, no. 47, thence N. 17' poles, to a white ash & sugar tree, thence N. 10° E. 41' poles, to a stone connect to Lot No. 3, and in the original line, thence N. 83° N. 142' poles to the beginning, containing 1.14 acres, being part in Union and part in Anderson Township.

Lot No. 2. Beginning at a stake N. corner of Lot No. 1, & connect to a blue ash, thence with a blue ash, line of 65' E. 17' poles, to a blue ash, red sugar tree, connect to Lot No. 3, thence N. 23° E. 167' poles, to a stone situate from a blue ash, N. 71° E. 23' links, corner to Lot No. 3, thence N. 38° E. 32' poles, to a blue ash, corner to Lot No. 1, thence to the line of Lot No. 1, 5.68' N. 238' poles, to the beginning, containing 12.3 acres, partly in Union and partly in Anderson Township.

Lot No. 3. Beginning at a blue ash, & sugar tree connect to Lot No. 2, thence with the line of Lot No. 2, N. 23° E. 182' poles, to a stone corner to Lot No. 1, situate from a sugar tree marked with 3 chips, N. 45° E. 27' links, also in the line of Lot No. 3, thence N. 23° E. 16' poles, to a sugar cane and sugar tree, thence N. 22° E. 22' poles, to a back lime & butter nut, connect to Lot No. 5, thence N. 67° E. 66' poles, to a white ash & hickory, corner to Lot No. 4, and in the line of Lot No. 5, thence N. 23° E. 157' poles, to a back & hickory corner to Lot No. 4, thence N. 67° E. 75' poles, to the place of beginning, containing 11.1 acres.

Lot No. 4. Beginning at a back & hickory connect to Lot No. 3, thence with the line of Lot No. 3, N. 23° E. 157' poles, to a white ash & back tree, connect to Lot No. 3, and in the line of Lot No. 5, thence with the line of Lot No. 5, 5.68' E. 120' poles, to a back tree, thence N. 23° E. 33' poles, to a back & hickory, thence N. 23° E. 106' poles, with the line of E. St. Davis's tract, an original corner, thence N. 83° N. 142' poles, to the beginning, containing 10.2 acres.

Lot No. 5. Beginning at a stone on the back bank of a branch, situate S. 60° E. 15' links, from an iron wood with 3 chips, corner to Lot No. 4, thence with the line of Lot No. 4, N. 41' poles, to a white ash & sugar tree, thence N. 23° E. 53' poles, to a sugar tree & hickory, thence N. 22° E. 22' poles, to a back lime & butter nut, thence N. 67° E. 116' poles, to a back tree, connect to Lot No. 4, thence N. 38° E. 187' poles to a stake, thence N. 83° N. 142' poles, to the place of beginning, containing 18.1 acres.

To the Mill tract (600') was added, supposed to be 45' acres, bounded on the E. by the Little Miami, on the N. by a lot called the Large Field, (supposed to contain 75 acres) bounded on the N. by the widow's dover, on that by the mill tract, all of which sold June 1829 to Geo H. Jones, (supposed to contain 75 acres) bounded on the N. by the widow's dover, on that by the mill tract, all of which sold June 1829 to Geo H. Jones, as agent of Daniel Turner, as agent of D. Bassett. The 100 acre tract on the E. side of the Little Miami, bound on the N. by the land of Isaac Turner, & Christian Beagle & on the E. by lands sold by the administrators of the estate to Geo H. Jones & Jacob Myers. The Large Field, bounded on the N. by the road leading from Cincinnati to Middletown, on that by the addition to the mill tract on the E. by the Little Miami, on the N. by the land of Lewis Ready, supposed to contain 75 acres, sold June 1829 to G. H. Jones, a strip of land lying N. of the widow's dover of 15' wide, in width, containing 260' bounded on the N. by the lands of Daniel Margrave & Stephen Palmer on the N. by the ministerial tract, on the E. by the widow's dover & on the S. by the Little Miami. Sold June 1829 to John Ready.

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
