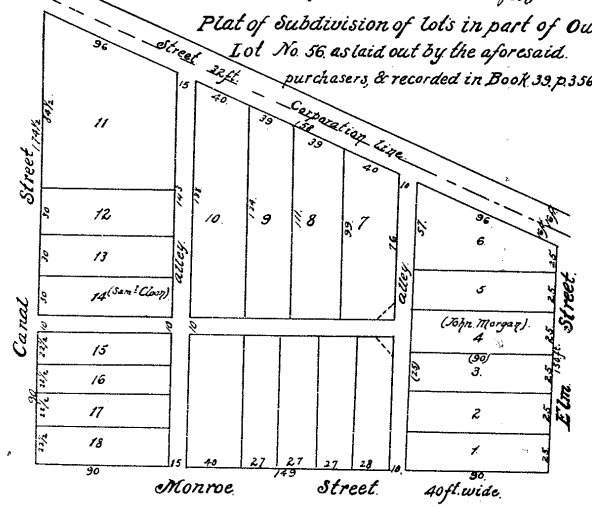
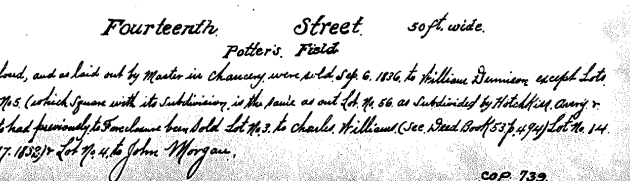
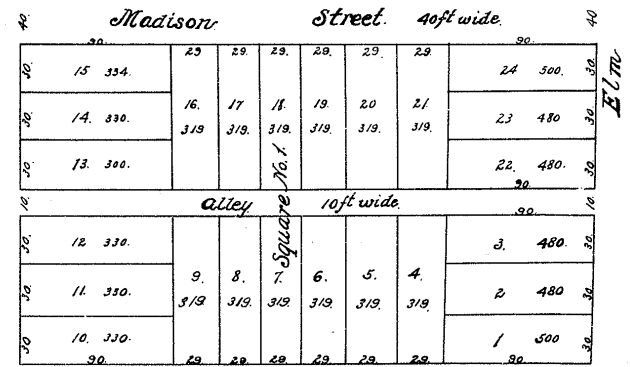
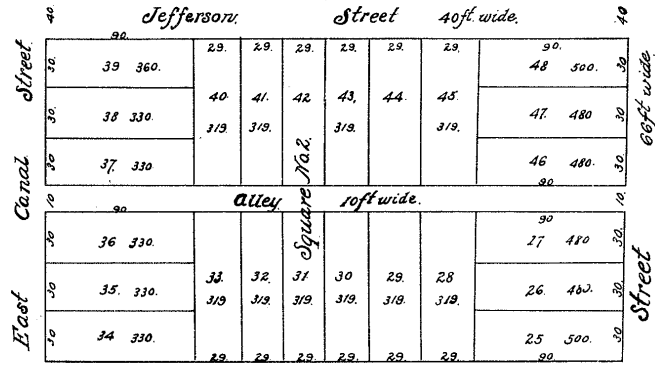
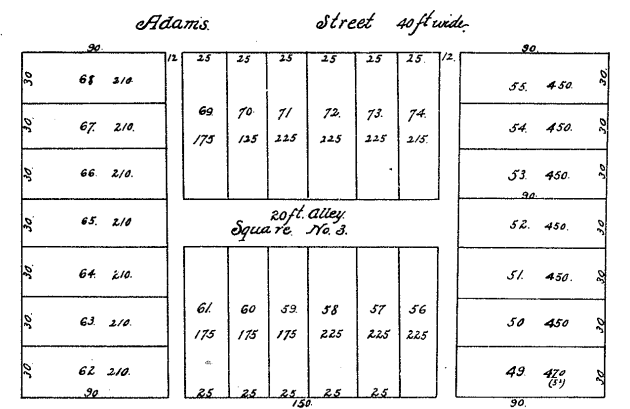
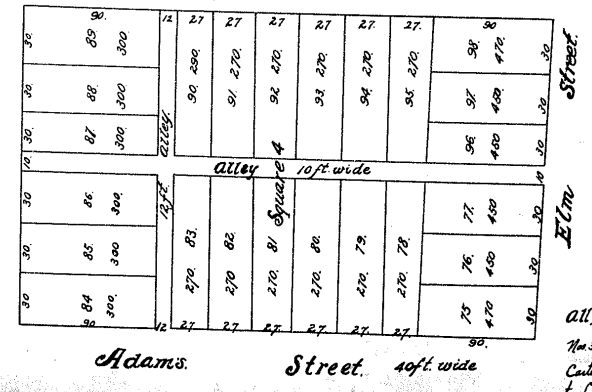
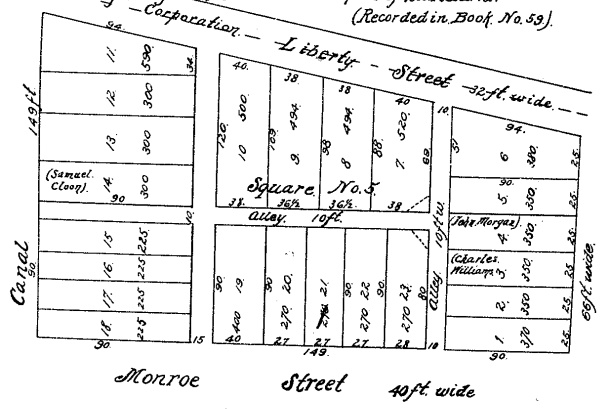


Vol 70, p. 143-162 (Nov Term 1836) Bill in Chancery of Foreclosed Mortgage of the following premises sold in June 1831 by the Trustees of the Bank to E. L. Baker, H. H. Keiser, John C. Carey, & Thomas Carter viz all that tract in Cincinnati between the Canal & Elm St. bounded N. by East Canal St. S. by Peter Field buying ground Out Lot No. 52 E. by Elm St. by the N. line of city or Liberty St. designated on the Map of Cincinnati as Out Lots Nos. 54, 55 & 56, except so much thereof as has been conveyed to the State for a Canal and for a public street, called East Canal St. being a strip of about 75 ft in width by about 1250 ft more or less in length off the N. side of said Out Lot.

All the premises foreclosed, and sold out by Master in Chancery were sold Sep 6, 1836 to William Demmon except lots Nos. 3, 4, 7, 14, in Square No. 5 (which square with its subdivision is the same as out lot No. 56 as subdivided by H. H. Keiser & Carter and) which lots had previously been sold lot No. 3 to Charles Williams (see Book 32, p. 357) lot No. 14 to Samuel Carey (July 17, 1832) lot No. 4 to John Morgan.
