



Vol 65 pg 141-157. (3<sup>rd</sup> Partition filed Sept 1st 1829) for Partition of Estate of Martin Baum situated in different parcels as follows: And a Tract or Covernment on New Creek, rig Beginning on the N. E. side of Third Street, and E. corner of the late Wm. Ladd's Lot, where he lived at the time of his death, running from thence N. W. to S. 25 poles west with the line of the said Ladd's Lot to the Sectional line which divides fractions Number Eighteen, Number 11 with said line belonging to the W. corner of Smith & Tandy's farm and then E. with the line of land Lot 11 & 25 the E. to S. 60 rods then of thence N. with line of First Street, passing the E. corner thereof, continuing the same N. 50 rods to a stake on the ridge, then N. 75 E. up the ridge to the top of the hill, west to a stake, then S. 25 E. on the ridge, going back E. 67 rods to a stake which stands in the S. boundary of the last described land, then S. with the ridge line to the corner of about half acre, & to the E. corner of lands purchased by said Martin Baum of Griffin Johnson, and also S. with the line of said tract purchased from Johnson to the S. end of the continuation of New & called High Street, thence S. 45 E. along the E. boundary of said Third Street to the place of beginning, containing by estimation 2.675 ac. of land in F. 1. D. & P. R. No. 1. in the easting field of covernment, as by the deed of the administrator of David Byrom deceased to said Martin Baum dated Nov. 15. 1810 and the Deed to him from Griffin & Johnson will appear excepting the lot sold by the said Martin to the Col. Directors & Co. of the Bank of the U.S. lying between Third & Sumner Streets & High St. and between Peter & Butler Streets, also the lots sold to Hedgeson Fox, Martin Shultz, John & Chapman Robins, Cadwaghter, also some of Philip George & Samuel Rogers, all of which were conveyed by said Martin Baum to his wife, also the residue of 1.717 ac. 10.872 sq. ft. & 2. after taking off the land sold to Hedgeson Long and others known by the following description viz Boundary on the E. & S. by the line of the said High Street, then for a line to be drawn from E. to S. across the said lot, parallel to the line of S. 30 E. for a line extending into the land comprising the three or four acres, back measure, as far as the depth of said lot, so that it will affect the tract hereinabove described from the line of the said lot, N. 40 rods, which is subject to some uncertainty in relation to the title also a tract of land on the S. side of Sumner Street between Third & Columbia Street, containing 1.66 ac. of land sold by Martin Baum on the S. side of said Sumner Street, being 1.66 ac. of land now owned by Lemuel Clark, and bounded with said line of S. 30 E. the said boundary line being S. 30 E. to N. 10 E. 51 ft. on which a small tract has been erected thereon by said Martin Baum in the center of the line of the said lots, in the long line of the said lot, 10 ft. from the measurement of the subdivision line, and opposite thereto stands a building 12' x 18' **PLAT & SURVEY OF SAID BAUM'S LANDS ON**


