




Plat of $\frac{7}{10}$ acre lately in possession of George Leiber, dead in Cincinnati, part of Sec 18, T. 17, R. 1, W. P. divided by a line at equal distance from the E & W lines, between the heirs of said Leiber & the heirs of Leibers late son, Edward Leiber, each party leaving not half a 50 ft. street called Pleasant from front to Third streets, Surveyed by his parties Dec 1, 1837, Joseph East, City Surveyor.

Deed and order of court, under hypothec of the aforesaid agreement, the heirs and devisees of George Leiber are entitled to the land in the Bifling in the Plat of Survey thus attached situated on E side of Rose street, beginning on said first of survey, being a square $\frac{1}{2}$ of the land described after laying out the said Rose street, and that the heirs of said George Leiber are entitled to the same as follows: Because of all their claims in interest in the said survey given to them and sufficient Reasons of all the claimants in interest in the said survey given to them, we entitle to the legal title of all the portion W. of Rose street according to Plat recd.

such.
