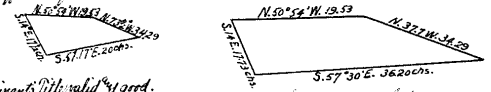
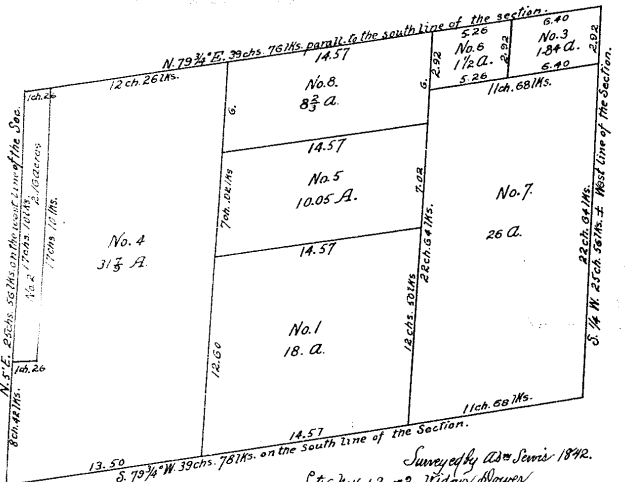

Miller, to James Kinley & Co. their indentures of Nov. 14 1838. He said in the bill that as follows: by and between from the center of the said section to the N.W. cor. of the said section a white oak tree with 3 notches in it, then in such direction with certain trees half of the said 1/4 Sec. for the better understanding of which the annexed plat is made contrary to the usual course, being the same boundary as said Wm. Miller by John Cheney, John Kinley & Co. June 6 1827 & John Bennet & Co. July 18 1827. 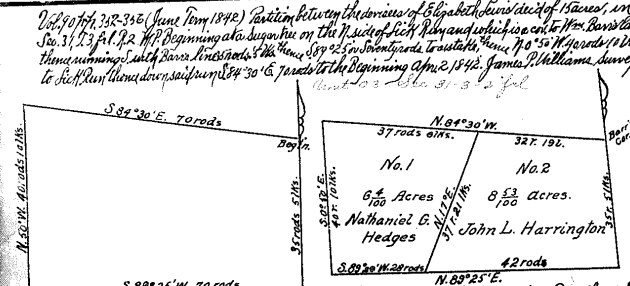

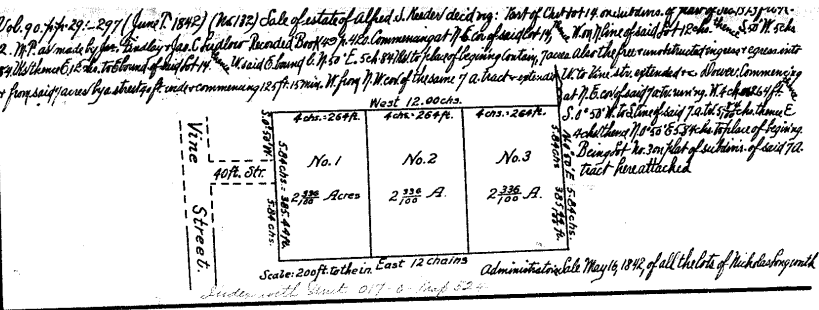

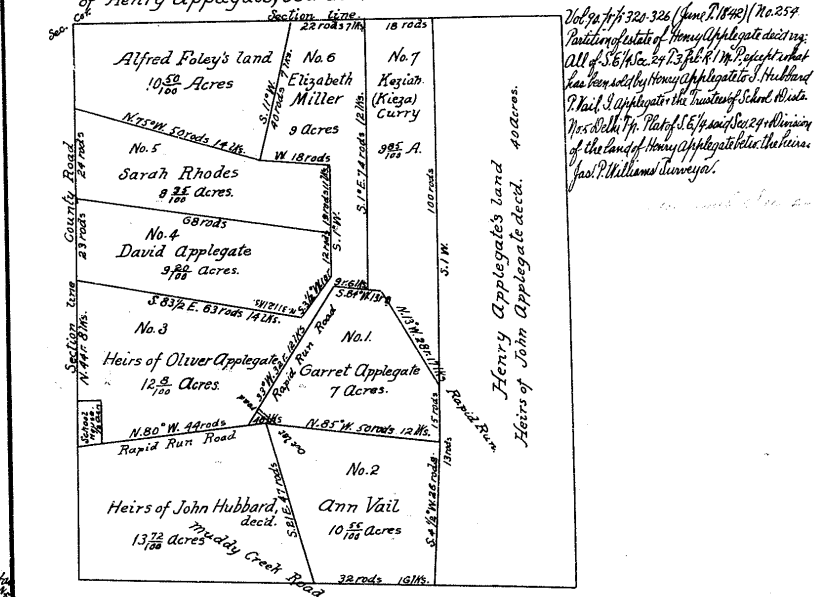
