76th Surface Grade of Frances Lane. Flat Rock Station - horizontal 3-18 feet 12th Oak ascend 0-7% top of hill - 1st Oak - tree - ascend 6-8% foot Small Black Oak, ascend 6-7% of 3th Oak ascend 5-10-13 feet 10th Walnut - ascend 2-1/2% 15 feet 1st Sassafras root - descend 2-1/2% 9 feet 18th Poplar - descend 2-1/2% 7 feet 20th Chestnut tree ascend 13% - 19 feet 21th middle of Hattaway's Lane 110 feet 15th E. Established Grade of Kempf's Lane. Beginning in the Columbia Hill Road and Second 10' to the Standard Stone 26 feet 15th. Then ascend 11% - 20' top 20% Gr. then descend to the Cedar tree 15 feet old. At such a grade as will make of flat at the tree, perhaps 2' below with a straight grade from the cedar tree to the surface of the ground at the Wind of Columbia No. 3 being about 4' descending the 10' descending with a grade of 5% following the course of the lane to the Gap Station. Then adopting the grade of surface to the Columbia Station at the end of Hattaway's lane, thence descend with a grade of about 4% to the flat of Station 20th. So of the Oak, then adopting the grade of the surface to the eastern boundary line. Established Grade of Hattaway's Lane. Beginning in the Columbia Hill Road, then adopting Surface Grade for the established grade to within a pole of the 23 foot station (219) 3 feet N. when the surface road begins to descend 7-1/2% then descend at the rate of 5% to the bottom of the hollow making a cut there at the end of the Frances Lane, thence ascend with a grade of about 2-2/3% to top of hill, making a cut there of 20' twenty feet, thence descend with a gr. of about 5-30 to Kempf's lane. Established Grade of Frances Lane is the surface grade with no elevation except raising at the Thompson's as to meet the 1/4% fall in Hattaway's lane. Division Lines. The line between 6th & 28, 29 is a continuation of John A. Thompson's house line East. The line between 33-34 is a line opposite the middle of the E. end of two lane No. 4 and two the same course (219) a straight angle to Kempf's and Hattaway's lane. The line during 26-31-35-36-37-38-39-40-41-42 commences in Hattaway's lane 20' N. of the apple witness tree to the intersection of Francis & Hattaway's lanes run straight angle to Hattaway's lane. The line between 35-37 begins in Hattaway's lane 10 feet 15th S. of the N. side of two lane No. 2 running thence a right angle to Hattaway's lane 13 feet N. to the head of hollow, thence S. 57-15 down the bank to David A. Kempf's line. The three courses of the 15' end of the tract are represented by the black line the course of resistance called for by Mr. Wright's Survey as represented by the dotted line.
